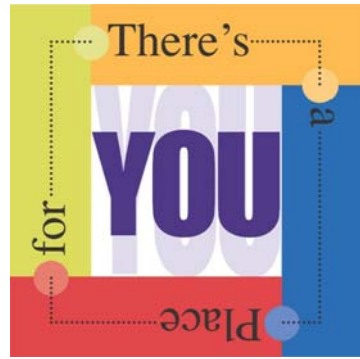

## 2009 Placement Report

### Guidelines

1. Information is based on graduates from the terms of Summer 2008, Fall 2008 and Spring 2009.
2. All percentages are represented by those responding to a question.
3. If graduates are part or full time employed and are still attending NCC, they are counted as "Available to Work".
4. Graduates are not available to work if they are a full time student at another institution or not working due to injury.
5. If "unemployed" is checked, they are counted as "Available to Work".
6. All employment information is based on full and part time information.
7. Each student is listed as the fullest degree they achieved only. For example, graduates of the Practical Nursing and Extended Practical Nursing programs in Summer 2008 and from the Associate Degree Nursing program in Spring 2009 are only listed as graduates of ADN.
8. Wage information is completely and accurately based on information from all graduates who returned their survey. Many graduates don't fill out that category, but filled out the rest of the form.
9. "Employed" means both related and unrelated employment. "Employed in related field" is work associated to their NCC coursework only.
10. Figures may be inconsistent from years prior to the 2003 Placement Report due to different methods of interpreting information and past mathematical errors. The Placement Reports since 2003 were done in a consistent fashion and can be compared accurately.
