Student Responsibilities for Success

- ★ Be in class every day.
- ★ Personal appointments (doctor, dental, etc.) should be made before or after class **or** on days you don't have class, whenever possible.

Grants Available!

We have **\$10,000** in Grant Aid money for TRiO students this year.

You may qualify for **\$1000** for the spring semester, if you:

- ★ receive a Pell Grant
- ★ are a full-time student (12 credits or more)
- ★ have a GPA of 2.0 or higher
- ★ participate in at least 6 activities through our office during the fall semester
- ★ **Priority given to first year TRiO students**

You must fill out an online application by December 10th at www.nwicc.edu in order to be considered. Awards will be part of your Spring Financial Aid package.

Remember: when we award Grant Aid, we look at how often you use our services, so if you don't sign in, you may not be eligible for the \$1000 Grant Aid in the spring term.
